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the chapters in art as an agent for social change presented as snapshots focus on exploring the power of drama dance visual arts media music poetry and film as educative artistic imaginative embodied and relational art forms that are agents of personal and societal change a range of methods and ontological views are used by the authors in this unique contribution to scholarship illustrating the comprehensive methodologies and theories that ground arts based research in canada the us norway india hong kong and south africa weaving together a series of chapters snapshots under the themes of community building collaboration

and teaching and pedagogy this book offers examples of how art as an agent for social change is of particular relevance for many different and often overlapping groups including community artists k university instructors teachers students and arts based educational researchers interested in using the arts to explore social justice in educative ways this book provokes us to think critically and creatively about what really matters

social arts are manifold and are initiated by multiple actors spaces and direction from many directions and intentions but generally they aim to generate personal familial group community or general social transformation which can maintain and enhance personal and community resilience communication negotiation and transitions as well as help with community building and rehabilitation civic engagement social inclusion and cohesion occurring via community empowerment institutions arts in health inter ethnic conflict and frames of lobbying for social change social art can transform and disrupt power relations and hegemonic narratives destigmatize marginalized groups and humanize society through creating empathy for the other this book provides a broad range of all of the above with multiple international examples of projects photo voice community theater crafts groups for empowerment creative place making arts in institutions and arts based participatory research that is initiated by social practitioners and by artists and in collaboration between the two the aim of this book is to help to illustrate explore and demystify this interdisciplinary area of practice with methods and theoretical orientation as the focus of each chapter the book can be used both in academic settings and for training social and art practitioners as well as for social practitioners and artists in the field

the early 21st century has seen contemporary art make continued use of audience participation in which the spectator becomes part of the artwork itself in this book kaija kaitavuori claims that the participator is a new artistic role that does not fall under the auspices of artist or spectator and in proving such she devises a four group typology of involvement her classification distinguishes between different forms of engagement and identifies their specific features the key criteria she proposes are how concepts of authorship and ownership shift in relation to collectively created work how contracts regulating the use and production of

shared work are arranged and the extent to which involvement in making art can be regarded as democratic this highly original book thus offers students and teachers the tools with which to improve their understanding of participatory art and removes the confusing terminology that has characterized so many other discussions

this book is devoted to one of the central problems of contemporary thinking for which c p snow in 1959 coined the phrase of the two cultures in this concept human endeavour is directed on one side to the forward looking sciences mathematics physics chemistry biology etc and on the other side to the backward looking humanities including psychology linguistics sociology etc in this dichotomy snow saw no possibility of unification on the other hand the urge towards self consistency and harmony in the mental and spiritual lives of both man and society as a whole is clearly one of the major forces of creativity both scientific and artistic this force aims at the unification of the two cultures in order to build an integrated self consistent system for our intellectual life some attempts in this direction have been made before and will be described in this book it is our aim to contribute to the achievement of an integrated mental life on the basis of information theory in order to construct our model we examine the laws of information theory leading us to the deduction of the main laws inherent in both cultures thus we consider the evolution of both non living and living matter human behaviour the phenomenon of language the sphere of aesthetics etc we hope that our work will be useful both for researchers who are trying to derive different integral theories and for various other consumers of scientific knowledge meaning broad circles of intellectuals

this book examines research using anti oppressive arts based methods to promote social change in oppressed and marginalized communities the contributors discuss literary techniques performance visual art and new media in relation to the co construction of knowledge and positionality reflexivity data representation community building and engagement and pedagogy the contributors to this volume hail from a wide array of disciplines including sociology social work community psychology anthropology performing arts education medicine and public health

gabriel rockhill opens new space for rethinking the relationship between art and politics rather than understanding the two spheres as separated by an insurmountable divide or linked by a privileged bridge rockhill demonstrates that art and politics are not fixed entities with a singular relation but rather dynamically negotiated sociohistorical practices with shifting and imprecise borders radical history and the politics of art proposes a significant departure from extant debates on what is commonly called art and politics and the result is an impressive foray into the force field of history in which cultural practices are meticulously analyzed in their social and temporal dynamism without assuming a conceptual unity behind them rockhill thereby develops an alternative logic of history and historical change as well as a novel account of social practices and a multidimensional theory of agency engaging with a diverse array of intellectual artistic and political constellations this tour de force diligently maps the various interactions between different dimensions of aesthetic and political practices as they intertwine and sometimes merge in precise fields of struggle

the book reveals how the social value of art may have one meaning for a policy maker another for a museum and still yet another for an artist and it is therefore in the interaction between these agents that we learn the most about the importance of rhetoric and interpretation as a trajectory in art history socially engaged art has a long and established history however in recent years or since the social turn that occurred in the 1990s the rhetoric surrounding the social value of art has been assimilated by cultural policy makers and museums interdisciplinary in its approach and bringing together contributions from artists curators

and academics the volume explores rhetoric social value and the arts within different social political and cultural contexts

in what we made tom Finkelpearl examines the activist participatory coauthored aesthetic experiences being created in contemporary art he suggests social cooperation as a meaningful way to think about this work and provides a framework for understanding its emergence and acceptance in a series of fifteen conversations artists comment on their experiences working cooperatively joined at times by colleagues from related fields including social policy architecture art history urban planning and new media issues discussed include the experiences of working in public and of working with museums and libraries opportunities for social change the lines between education and art spirituality collaborative opportunities made available by new media and the elusive criteria for evaluating cooperative art Finkelpearl engages the art historians Grant Kester and Claire Bishop in conversation on the challenges of writing critically about this work and the aesthetic status of the dialogical encounter he also interviews the often overlooked co-creators of cooperative art expert participants who have worked with artists in his conclusion Finkelpearl argues that pragmatism offers a useful critical platform for understanding the experiential nature of social cooperation and he
