the elements of style is a study guide for the development of writing style by william strunk jr a professor of english at cornell university it was later finished by his student elwyn brooks white now it is commonly known as the study guide by strunk and white in short this book is for someone who wants to become a writer the elements of style is some kind of examples collection of all kinds of styles of writing very different works it comprises eight elementary rules of usage ten elementary principles of composition a few matters of form a list of 49 words and expressions commonly misused and a list of 57 words often misspelled

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some rules are bent others are broken not knowing the rules is no excuse strunk writes about the laws which govern our language there must be some structure to language we must agree on some aspects of it and creating rules and definitions around those mutual agreements helps to foster intelligibility throughout the language it likewise supports the assertion that language may change but not as much as you might think strunk is just as useful to an author today as it was when it was compiled it is light hearted and often humorous and presents language and communication in a thoughtful way any writer should come away from this book with a new respect for language and with a keener eye for seeing their own writing for anyone who wants to write and communicate precisely to enable their readers to get the most out of their writing this book is a must every author needs a copy on their bookshelf for study and re study get your copy now
