ecology cultural studies and trust theories into empirical research going beyond theoretically developed research advances it has practical implications urging journalistic profession to engage in transparent and ethical practices policymakers to increase media literacy as well as control platform accountability and educators to train citizens in order to be ready to deal with an unfamiliar media world the weaknesses are the regional scope and failure of generalizing into other parts of the world the fast paced development of digital spaces that might result in the change of forms of trust and the impossibility to critically examine the effects of algorithms the additional directions of future research are broad scale cross cultural research longitudinal study on trust and the study of ai in journalism as well as interdisciplinary cooperation in coming up with novel trust building strategies the study highlights the need to re establish the credibility of digital journalism through culture sensitive transparent and flexible means that respects the diversity among its audience and promotes the principles of democracy within an ever more digital media
